The T-Bones and Dogs were scoreless through three. Chicago grabbed the lead but KC tied it up and scored the first earned run against Luke Westphal this season. Chicago finally broke through in the fifth to take a 5-1 lead and would hold on for a 6-2 win.

Tonight

The T-Bones will hit the road for the first game of a seven-game road trip to Texas. Kansas City will face the Cleburne RailRoaders for the first game of a three-game series.

Matchups

LHP Henry Owens gets the nod for Kansas City to face **RHP Nefi Ogando** for Cleburne. The Boston Red Sox selected Owens in the first round (36th overall) of the 2011 MLB Draft. He signed with them on August 15, 2011 for a \$1,500,000 signing bonus. Owens made his professional debut in 2012 with the Greenville Drive of the Class A South Atlantic League (SAL), sporting a 12–5 record and a 4.87 ERA in 23 games. He would climb the system and earn a promotion to the Major Leagues on August 4, 2015. He made his debut by striking out the first batter he faced in the game, Jacoby Ellsbury and went on to allow three runs in five innings to take the loss against the New York Yankees. He collected his first MLB win in his second start on August 9 against the Detroit Tigers at Comerica Park, allowing one run through five innings. He spent parts of two seasons in the Big Leagues in 2015 and 2016 with a 4-6 record and a 5.19 ERA in 85.0 innings. He was claimed off waivers by Arizona in 2017 and the Los Angeles Dodgers in 2018. He was released and resigned by Arizona in 2018 and was released from their organization in March 2019. Nefi Ogando spent parts of two seasons in the Big Leagues with the Phillies in 2015 and Marlins in 2016. He was originally an international free-agent signee by the Boston Red Sox in 2010 reaching High A before being traded to the Phillies in 2014. He would climb to ladder with the Phillies and make his debut on September 9, 2015. The Miami Marlins claimed Ogando off waivers in 2016 where he would spend time at AAA and the Big Leagues in 2016. Ogando spent 2017 with the Cincinnati Reds organization and signed with Cleburne this past off-season.

The T-Bones traded infielder **Mikey Reynolds** to Sussex County in the Can-Am League on Monday and have signed **LHP Henry Owens** today.

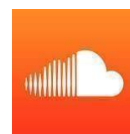

Roster Moves II

The T-Bones have signed **OF Danny Mars** and released **IF Carlos Franco**. Mars joins the T-Bones roster after playing with the Red Sox AA team, the Portland Sea Dogs in 2018. Mars was drafted in 2014 by the Boston Red Sox out of Chipola College after batting .380 in 166 at-bats with 35 RBI's. Mars has spent his entire minor league career in the Red Sox farm system starting with the single A affiliate the Greenville Drive and the low A Lowell Spinners in 2014. Mars would then go on to play for the Red Sox rookie team in 2015 and the Red Sox fall team the Surprise Saguaros in 2016. Mars final stop was with the Portland Sea Dogs in 2017 and 2018 before being released by the Sea Dogs on March 29, 2019. The Team also signed **RHP Erik Manoah** on Saturday. Erik Manoah was drafted by the New York Mets in the 13th round of the 2014 Draft out of South Dade High School in Homestead, Florida. In high school, Manoah owned a 1.83 ERA and struck out 116 batters in his senior season. Manoah joins the T-Bones after pitching with the Inland Empire 66ers in 2018, a Class A Advanced associate of the Los Angeles Angels. Manoah is also the brother of Alek Manoah, who most recently got drafted in the first round of the 2019 draft to the Toronto Blue Jays out of West Virginia University.

Washington's Late RBI Secures Series Win for KC

6/11/2011

The Winnipeg Goldeyes (15-14) erased a four-run deficit in the seventh inning, but Rico Washington (pictured) used an RBI single in the ninth to lead the Kansas City T-Bones (13-15) to a 5-4 win as they secured their third straight series victory on Saturday night in Winnipeg, MB, Canada.

Keanon Simon began the game with a triple against Isaac Hess and scored on a single by Jimmy Mojica to give Kansas City a 1-0 lead in the first inning. After adding a single tally in the second, the T-Bones gained a three-run advantage in the fourth on a solo home run by Ray Sadler, his sixth of the season.

Hess left after six innings having allowed three runs on five hits, but would not factor into the decision.

An RBI single by Fernando Garcia scored Brian Joynt in the seventh to give Kansas City a 4-0 lead.

Kris Johnson, who signed with the T-Bones just hours before the game, held Winnipeg scoreless through six innings before walking Louis Ott to begin the bottom of the seventh. Johnson surrendered just four hits in his outing before giving way to Trent Lare after the free pass with Kansas City ahead, 4-0.

The Goldeyes loaded the bases against Lare with a walk and an error by Garcia. Price Kendall followed and was hit by the first pitch of his at bat to force in the first Winnipeg run of the contest. Cole Lohden (1-0) entered and allowed the second run to score on a groundout before surrendering a two-run single to Wes Long that tied the game at four.

Lohden finished the seventh and added a scoreless eighth to earn his first win of the season. Johnson was charged with one run while Lare was tagged with three runs, two earned, without allowing a hit.

Garcia opened the ninth inning against Jamie Vermilyea (1-1) with a single and advanced to second on a sacrifice bunt by Simon. Washington followed two batters later to reclaim the lead for Kansas City, 5-4.

Vermilyea took the loss after allowing one run on two hits in an inning of work. Andy Shipman surrendered two two-out hits in the bottom of the ninth, but closed out the game with a strikeout of Justin Bass to earn his seventh save. He has now converted six straight save opportunities, all coming within an eight-day span.

Fox had a perfect night at the plate, finishing three-for-three with five RBI. He reached in his fourth at bat when hit by a pitch. Fox's three home runs matches the single-game T-Bones record set by Eddie Pearson on August 6, 2004 against the Joliet JackHammers. The T-Bones also broke the team record for triples in a game with three on the night.

T-BONES ADD LEFTY OWENS

CLEBURNE, Texas– The Kansas City T-Bones announced today that the club has signed former Red Sox and Diamondbacks farmhand, lefty Henry Owens, as a corresponding roster move following the trade of infielder Mikey Reynolds to fill the open roster spot.

Owens attended Edison High School in Huntington Beach, California. He earned the Cal-Hi Sports Mr. Baseball State Player of the Year Award in 2011, after posting a 12–1 record with a 1.15 earned run average (ERA) and three saves, while striking out 140 batters in 91⅓ innings of work. He also was named a 2011 Louisville Slugger High School All-American and earned 2011 Sunset League Pitcher of the Year honors for the two consecutive years.

The Boston Red Sox selected Owens in the first round (36th overall) of the 2011 MLB Draft. He signed with them on August 15, 2011 for a \$1,500,000 signing bonus. Owens made his professional debut in 2012 with the Greenville Drive of the Class A South Atlantic League (SAL), sporting a 12–5 record and a 4.87 ERA in 23 games, including 130 strikeouts and 47 walks in 101⅓ innings. In addition, he finished fourth in the SAL for the most strikeouts, while tying for fourth in wins.

Entering 2013, Owens was ranked as the eighth best prospect in the Red Sox organization and ranked 77th in the MLB.com Top 100 Prospects list. He was promoted to the Salem Red Sox of the Class A-Advanced Carolina League on April 2. On July 17, he struck out a season-high tying 10 in six innings, while combining with two other pitchers to deliver the first no-hitter in franchise history in a 6–0 win over the Frederick Keys. Overall, he posted an 8–5 record and a 2.92 ERA over 20 starts for Salem, including a hitless streak of 19⅓ innings, gaining a promotion to the Portland Sea Dogs of the Class AA Eastern League on August 1.

With the Sea Dogs, Owens went 3–1 with a 1.78 ERA, striking out 46 in just 30⅓ innings over six starts. He was a Carolina League Mid-Season All-Star, as well as SoxProspects.com's 2013 Pitcher of the Year. Additionally, he made the Baseball America Minor League All-Star Team. Owens started the 2014 season by pitching a rain-shortened six-inning no-hitter for the Sea Dogs. Making 20 starts in Portland, Owens compiled a record of 14–4 with three complete games in 121 innings, with 126 strikeouts and an earned run average of 2.60. He was promoted to the Pawtucket Red Sox of the Class AAA International League on August 2, 2014. He was a mid-season and postseason All-Star with Portland as well as Eastern League Pitcher of the Year. Owens was invited to Spring Training with the Red Sox in 2015 but began the season with Pawtucket. He was 3–8 with a 3.16 ERA in 21 AAA starts.

The Red Sox promoted Owens to the major leagues on August 4. He made his debut by striking out the first batter he faced in the game, Jacoby Ellsbury and went on to allow three runs in five innings to take the loss against the New York Yankees. He collected his first MLB win in his second start on August 9 against the Detroit Tigers at Comerica Park, allowing one run through five innings. He made 11 starts in 2015, with a 4–4 record and 4.57 ERA. He spent most of the 2016 season with Pawtucket, where he was 10–7 with a 3.92 ERA in 24 starts but he also made five starts for the Red Sox in the majors, and was 0–2 with a 6.95 ERA in those appearances.
