Last Game

The T-Bones franchise and season high 12 game winning streak game to a halt last night in a 5-0 blanking by the Explorers. It was the first time this season KC has been shut out by their opponent. It was a four run second that the T-Bones suffered at the hands of the Sioux City bats that did most of the damage as the series is now even at one each.

Today

The T-Bones continue a key six game road trip with the final game of a three-game series against the Sioux City Explorers in Sioux City, Iowa.

Pitching Matchup

RHP Dylan Baker takes the bump for KC. Baker comes to KCK after one season with the Los Angeles Dodgers organization where he went 3-6 in 34 games all in relief with a 6.08 ERA over 37 innings and notched eight saves in 2018. Primarily a starter throughout his career, it was his first season to notch a save as a pitcher. Prior to his one season with the Dodgers system, he spent 2012 to 2017 with the Cleveland Indians organization. Baker was selected in the fifth round of the 2012 First-Year Player Draft by the Cleveland Indians and made his debut in the rookie Arizona League that summer.

RHP Carlos Sierra is a native of Cuba who played one year in the Cuban National Series before signing with the Houston Astros as an International free agent. He would spend three seasons with the Astros organization reaching AA Corpus Christi in 2018. Sierra has primarily been a bull pen arm making 96 appearances in his career and this season transitioned to a starter. He has made 12 career starts coming into tonight with a career record of 13-9 with a 3.74 ERA.

Up next

Following the series with Sioux City the T-Bones return home to face Lincoln for four games with Wednesday the 21st a double header to make up a rain out back on May 22nd. KC will return to Sioux City for the team's second visit to Iowa this month following the Lincoln series.

Ouch...that will leave a mark!

The T-Bones lead the league in hitting batters from the mound. The club leads the circuit with 70 hit by pitches. Last season the team was tied for second most in the AA with 68. The batters have been hit 38 times this season after being hit only 45 times all last season and this season are 8th.

What a ride it was

Kansas City 12-game winning streak that came to a stop last night was a franchise best. The T-Bones won nine in a row twice once in 2004 from August 21 to August 31 and the second last June from the 18th through the 28th. Those two streaks were the franchise longest with eight being achieved three times until this season. It is tied for the longest streak in the league this season with Sioux City who won 12 from July 19th – July 31st. The longest American Association streak was 15 by Pensacola in 2010. According to the research department (i.e. Luke Schrock) the T-Bones during the 12-game winning streak hit .312 with six game with 10 plus hits with one game reaching 19. In the pitching department along with the 10 quality starts the team has a 3.11 ERA. Here are the longest and the dates of the streaks for KC.

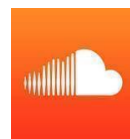

-KC is averaging 4.23 walks a game.
-The staff has an ERA of 4.10 for the month of August. The T-Bones finished with a 3.87 ERA in the month of July the best month so far of the season.
-The staff has allowed the fewest hits in the league at 693. The lowest the team has allowed since moving to KCK was 861 in 2019. That total was the second lowest in the AA last season.
-Dylan Baker has tossed three straight quality starts giving up just five earned runs in 22.1 innings with 16 strike outs.

Misc.

-The last two T-Bones shut outs of their opponents happened away from T-Bones Stadium at Lincoln July 7th and July 25th at Sioux Falls.
-KC is a perfect 5-0 in shutout games.
-The series win at St. Paul was only the second series win on the road against the North the other being Chicago and the third overall against the North.
-The T-Bones have won four series in a row and all four this year against Cleburne.

T-Bones Tie Franchise Record for Wins in 6-4 Victory

The Kansas City T-Bones (48-35) matched their franchise high for wins in a season with their 48th win of the year in a 6-4 victory Friday night over the Joliet JackHammers (42-42) at Silver Cross Field.

The T-Bones struck first in the top of the second against Paul Fagan with a two-run frame, scoring their first run on a two-out home run by Keith Hernandez. An RBI triple by Keanon Simon (pictured) two batters later pushed the score to 2-0. Joliet quickly answered against Reid Santos in the bottom half of the frame, tying the game with RBI singles from Ryan Wehrle and Roberto Mena.

The JackHammers took a 3-2 lead in the fifth on an RBI single by former T-Bone Brad Correll, but Kansas City answered in the top of the sixth with an RBI double by Simon to even the score at three. Both starters left after six innings, and neither factored into the decision. Santos was charged with three runs on nine hits while walking two and striking out four. Fagan allowed his three runs on seven hits while walking four and striking out three.

Steven Stewart (5-3) and William Jackel (5-3) combined to throw scoreless seventh innings of relief before a two-run eighth inning from Kansas City gave them a 5-3 advantage. An RBI single by Jimmy Mojica drove in the first run and chased Jackel from the contest with two outs in the frame. Mojica scored on a single by the next batter, Simon.

Joliet picked up their final run against Stewart in the bottom of the eighth on a leadoff home run by Jon Nelson. Kansas City added their final run on a bases-loaded walk from Hernandez against Wes Alsup in the ninth.

Drew Shetrone threw a perfect ninth for Kansas City to earn his third save with the T-Bones.

Simon finished three-for-four with three RBI, falling a home run shy of the cycle. The T-Bones turned a triple play to end the first inning on a lineout by Correll, doubling off runners at second and first to complete the feat. It marked the second triple play in T-Bones history, with the previous coming during the 2006 season.

Dylan Baker comes to KCK after one season with the Los Angeles Dodgers organization where he went 3-6 in 34 games all in relief with a 6.08 ERA over 37 innings and notched eight saves in 2018. Primarily a starter throughout his career, it was his first season to notch a save as a pitcher. Prior to his one season with the Dodgers system, he spent 2012 to 2017 with the Cleveland Indians organization. Baker was selected in the fifth round of the 2012 First-Year Player Draft by the Cleveland Indians and made his debut in the rookie Arizona League that summer, going 0-1 with a 4.13 ERA in 24 innings, making eight starts in his eight games. He added 30 strike outs his first season. In 2013 at Lake County in the Midwest League, Baker went 7-6 in 27 games, making 25 starts over a 143.2 career-high innings. He would strike out 117 on the season at low A. Baker logged a team-best 143.2 innings, finishing with team-highs in victories (7) and strikeouts (117) and ranked among Midwest League leaders in starts (4th, 25), innings (4th, 143.2), strikeouts (4th, 117) and ERA (13th, 3.63). Baker also ranked fifth in ERA among all Cleveland minor leaguers that season and earned the Indians Minor League Player of the Week for June 19th – 25th that season. The 2014 season began with promise for Baker at high A Carolina. He would work six innings of no-hit ball with four strike outs, but he would miss a majority of the season because of a broken right ankle, suffered after making his first start of the season. He would be activated from the DL on July 21 and slowly work his way back. Baker would go to the rookie level Arizona league for three games where he posted a 1.59 ERA in 5.2 innings, and then Baker headed back to high A in the Carolina League to close out the season. He would finish the year going at least five innings in his last four starts, including back-to-back quality starts where he held the opposition to four runs over 12 innings. In his final 19 innings of the season, Baker allowed just five earned runs. He would go 3-3 overall with the Mudcats with a 4.05 ERA in nine starts in 46.2 innings. Baker once again had to fight off the injury bug in 2015. He was limited to just one start, coming April 9 at Potomac where he worked five hitless innings while walking one and fanning nine. Baker was diagnosed with an elbow strain after the start and was placed on the DL, eventually undergoing right elbow reconstruction on May 20. Baker then underwent a clean-up procedure (scar tissue) on January 8 that delayed the start of his 2016 season. He would be rewarded despite the setbacks and was added to the 40-man roster on November 20 of 2015 by Cleveland. The 2016 was a "wash" for Baker owing to the 2015 surgeries. He was limited in his return to the mound as he experienced discomfort at each step along his rehabilitation efforts and was forced to undergo and additional arthroscopic procedure on August 16 to address posterior elbow and forearm soreness. Baker returned in 2017 and started the season on the DL because of the previous two seasons of setbacks. He went a combined 1-1 with a 2.70 ERA in 17 games with two starts with AA Akron in the Eastern League and Rookie level Arizona. Baker struck out 16 while giving up just one walk. He pitched in 13 games at AA, going 0-1 with a 2.84 ERA, and he struck out 10 against one walk and pitched in another four games (two starts) for Rookie-level Arizona Indians while in rehab with a back injury from July 23 to August 14. The Indians recalled Baker on September 1 and shut him down for the rest of the season, placing him on the 60-day disabled list with a right shoulder strain and ending his season. Baker, a native of Alaska, graduated from Douglas High School, in Juneau, Alaska, before attending Tacoma Community College. He then transferred to Western Nevada College where he became the highest draft selection for a player out of Western Nevada in 2012.
