Henry Owens went five strong innings and the pen had one of it's best outings of the season.

Today

The T-Bones hit the road for a seven-game road trip through Chicagoland. Stop #1 is the first of a four-game series against the Chicago Dogs under the final approach to O'Hare. The team will move on at week's end to Gary and the south side/Indiana burbs to face the RailCats.

Pitching Matchups

RHP Erik Manoah makes his third start since joining the T-Bones on June 9th. Manoah was drafted by the New York Mets in the 13th round of the 2014 Draft out of South Dade High School in Homestead, Florida. Manoah joins the T-Bones after pitching with the Inland Empire 66ers in 2018, a Class A Advanced associate of the Los Angeles Angels. Manoah is also the brother of Alek Manoah, who most recently got drafted in the first round of the 2019 draft to the Toronto Blue Jays out of West Virginia University. Manoah spent two years with the New York Mets organization and another four with the Los Angeles Angels of Anaheim system. In six seasons he is a career 18-34 with a 5.68 ERA in 383.2 minor league innings.
LHP Jake Dahlberg is set to go for Chicago. The lefty was the 21st round pick by the St. Louis Cardinals out of the University of Illinois-Chicago in 2017. He spent 2017 and 2018 with the Cards organization before his release and signing on with Chicago. In three college seasons he was 24-12 with a 3.52 ERA and with the Cardinals he would post a 7-5 record and a 3.12 ERA.

Weekend Moves

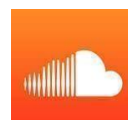
The T-Bones signed former Major Leaguer infielder **Chris Colabello**. Colabello began his climb to the show in indy ball back in 2005 in the CAN-AM League. He would eventually make his way into the affiliated ranks after seven years in independent baseball and make his debut on May 22, 2013 when he was called up by the Minnesota Twins. He would spend parts of four seasons in the Big Leagues between Minnesota and Toronto playing in 225 games with a career .257 average with 28 home runs and 111 RBI. Colabello may be remembered locally by Kansas City fans as the player who hit a solo home run in Game 5 of the 2015 American League Championship Series. That long ball would help the Blue Jays top the Kansas City Royals on October 21 and force a Game 6. To make room Colabello the T-Bones have released **Ryan Brett**. The T-Bones have also activated **IF Mason Davis** from the inactive list.

All- Time Vs. Chicago

The Dogs took two of three in KCK in early June. The two teams have met in two previous series in the first season of the Dogs franchise in 2018. The T-Bones swept the first series between the two clubs ever at Impact Field in Chicago back in late May of 2018. That series also included KC winning the first ever regular season game at Impact Field in comeback fashion. On May 28th Zach Walters and Angel Rosa each went deep (Walters twice) as the T-Bones rallied for a late 8-4 comeback win. KC leads the series 6-3 in the short time the two clubs have been playing over the last two seasons.

About the Dogs

The Chicago Dogs are in their second season in the American Association. The team is managed by former Big-League skipper Butch Hobson who also spent time with three different clubs as a player in the Major Leagues. Infielder Keon Barnum has gone yard nine times with 25 RBIs to lead the club in both categories. OF Tony Rosselli has hit eight home runs and has 22 RBIs for the Dogs to add to a solid 1-2 punch in the lineup. On the mound lefty Luke Westphal is 5-0 with a 2.05 ERA in 39.1 has become one of the leagues best arms. The big attraction for the Dogs is 11-year Major Leaguer and former Chicago Cub Carlos Zambrano who is a two-way player for the club. He boasts a 4.38 ERA in 12.1 innings of relief and is 3-for-18 at the plate on the season with three RBI. He had two hits against KC last time the two teams met, and all three RBI have come against the T-Bones.

On to Mexico

RHP and Olathe native **Jon Perrin** has his contract sold to AAA Mexico on Friday the 20th. Sold the contract of RHP Jon Perrin to Acereros de Norte (Monclova) (Mexican League). Perrin was 2-0 with a 3.12 ERA for the T-Bones in four starts. He had 29 strike outs in 24 innings.

At the plate

-**Christian Correa** has reached base in 15 straight games.

-**Ramsey Romano** has 19RBI in his first 21 games as a T-Bone. He went 8-for-24 on the last road trip with six RBI. The third baseman also leads the club with eight multi RBI games this season. He went 2-for-8 over the weekend against Cleburne with two RBI.

-**Roy Morales** went 1 for 3 yesterday with and RBI. He has six multi-hit games out of his last eight and had the game winning walk off RBI Friday night. He was 7-for-12 in the series at Cleburne May 11-13 with 4 RBI . He posted the first 4 RBI for the T-Bones Friday June 14th at Texas. He went 11-of-24 on the last road trip. He has six RBI against Cleburne this season and is 10-for-20 against them this season.

-**Casey Gillaspie** hit a three-run homer Sunday going 2-for-4 and has a six-game hitting streak and his fourth two hit night in a Sunday. The T-Bones first baseman hit his 12th double Friday night which ties him for second in the AA. He was 4-for-8 with Sioux City with a pair of walks and three RBI. T-Bones Win Fifth Straight Series

LITTLE FALLS, NJ. – The Kansas City T-Bones won both games, of Wednesday's double-header, 5-2, and 7-1, against the Jackals, at Yogi Berra Stadium.

The T-Bones received five strong innings, of two-run baseball, from starting pitcher Blake Holovach (3-0) to help set-up a game one win. Holovach, picked up the win and gave way to a two-inning save from Fernando Hernandez (2).

The T-Bones in game one, scored twice in the opening frame, collecting RBI hits from Adam Bailey and Kyle Robinson. Robinson in the sixth inning picked up his second RBI of the game, which gave Kansas City their second lead of the game, at 3-2. Robby Kuzdale drove in Nate Tenbrink and Kyle Robinson with two-outs in the seventh inning, giving Kansas City a final 5-2 win.

The T-Bones offense erupted for seven runs in game two of the double-header. The T-Bones scored three in the first, and two in the second to jump out to an early 5-0 lead. Robinson added a bases-clearing double in the first inning. The T-Bones, got three scoreless innings from starting pitcher Kris Regas and Derek Loera (1-0) picked up the win, as he allowed just one run over the final four innings.

The two wins, pull Kansas City within two games of .500. After starting the season 1-10, the T-Bones have rebounded with a 12-5 record over the last 17 games.

Erik Manoah Jr. was drafted by the New York Mets in the 13th round of the 2014 Draft out of South Dade High School in Homestead, Florida. In high school, Manoah owned a 1.83 ERA and struck out 116 batters in his senior season.

Manoah joins the T-Bones after pitching with the Inland Empire 66ers in 2018, a Class A Advanced associate of the Los Angeles Angels. Manoah is also the brother of Alek Manoah, who most recently got drafted in the first round of the 2019 draft to the Toronto Blue Jays out of West Virginia University.

After being drafted by the Mets, Manoah pitched with the Mets' rookie teams, first the GCL Mets in 2014 and then he was assigned to the Kingsport Mets during the 2015 season after acquiring a 2.63 ERA in eight games pitched with GCL. Manoah had a short stint with the Brooklyn Cyclones, a Short-Season A classification team, towards the end of the 2015 season. He was traded to the Angels for right-handed pitcher Fernando Salas in 2016.

Manoah was then assigned to the Burlington Bees in September of 2017 and then he was promoted to the 66ers, where he spent the rest of his time. Throughout parts of two seasons with the 66ers, Manoah posted a collective 7.71 ERA in 113.2 inning pitched throughout 33 games. He was released by the Inland Empire 66ers on May 7, 2019.
