Pitching Matchups

RHP Erik Manoah makes his third start since joining the T-Bones on June 9th. Manoah was drafted by the New York Mets in the 13th round of the 2014 Draft out of South Dade High School in Homestead, Florida. Manoah joins the T-Bones after pitching with the Inland Empire 66ers in 2018, a Class A Advanced associate of the Los Angeles Angels. Manoah is also the brother of Alek Manoah, who most recently got drafted in the first round of the 2019 draft to the Toronto Blue Jays out of West Virginia University. Manoah spent two years with the New York Mets organization and another four with the Los Angeles Angels of Anaheim system. In six seasons he is a career 18-34 with a 5.68 ERA in 383.2 minor league innings.

RHP Jumpei Akanuma a native of Kyoto, Japan took the US college route to pro ball. The rookie pitched three years at the College of the Desert (Palm Desert, CA) before finishing up his senior season at Lee University (Cleveland, TN).

About the RailCats

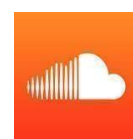

On the rise

Twist of Fate

The T-Bones as a pitching staff are second in strike outs (328) and have allowed the third fewest hits in the circuit (307) but have the third highest ERA in the AA at 5.20. The twist is the club leads the league in walks issued (162) and hit the second most batters at 29. The T-Bones have issued 191 extra base runners this season.

On the air

Dan Vaughan returns for his third season as the “voice of the T-Bones.” Vaughan spent the previous four years with the Gary SouthShore RailCats and is the Australian summer voice of the Perth Heat of the Australian Baseball League during the USA winters. Moving on up

The T-Bones lost eight players during the 2018 season to affiliated ball and three more to Mexico, yet still somehow reached a franchise best 26 games above .500. Since opening day 2018 the T-Bones have had 16 players' contracts purchased and five players sign with Mexico. This season the club has lost one to Mexico and four to affiliated ball.

- Christian Correa** went 2-for-5 with 2 RBI at Chicago. Has reached base in 17 straight games.

He had his fourth three hit game of the season last night and is 15 for-his-last 34 in his last eight games. He scored four runs Friday night the 14th at Texas the first time a T-Bone has done that in 2019 and the highest total since August 2018. In the Texas series he went 5-for-11 scoring seven runs.
- Daniel Nava** is 3-for-11 on the road trip with a home run at Chicago and four walks.

T-Bones Blank 'Hammers, 4-0

All-star hurler Luis Villarreal (2-2) threw seven shutout innings for the Kansas City T-Bones (19-20) tonight as they blanked the Joliet JackHammers (15-27), 4-0, at Silver Cross Field.

Villarreal allowed just six hits in the victory while striking out seven. The JackHammers made the left-hander work in the second inning, loading the bases on two hits and a walk before Villarreal struck out Gary Harris to end the threat. Joliet put two more runners on with one out in the third, but a strikeout and flyout capped off another scoreless frame.

After facing the minimum over the next three innings thanks to a caught stealing and double play, Villarreal saw one more JackHammers' runner reach third with two outs in the seventh before inducing a groundout from Harris to end his night.

Kansas City scored the decisive run in the second inning when Neb Brown collected a two-out solo home run off Ryan Gehring (2-3) for a 1-0 lead. They plated their second run on an RBI double by Jim Fasano in the sixth, scoring Damian Rolls who reached on a throwing error to begin the inning.

Gehring left after six having surrendered two runs, one earned, on eight hits in the loss.

Kansas City scored their final two runs in the eighth on RBI singles by Ryan Fox and Mark Minicozzi.

Daniel Sattler relieved Villarreal in the eighth and surrendered three walks, two with two outs, to load the bases for Freddy Thon. Thon grounded out to end the threat.

Weston Curles threw a scoreless ninth to finish the game for Kansas City.

Erik Manoah Jr. was drafted by the New York Mets in the 13th round of the 2014 Draft out of South Dade High School in Homestead, Florida. In high school, Manoah owned a 1.83 ERA and struck out 116 batters in his senior season.

Manoah joins the T-Bones after pitching with the Inland Empire 66ers in 2018, a Class A Advanced associate of the Los Angeles Angels. Manoah is also the brother of Alek Manoah, who most recently got drafted in the first round of the 2019 draft to the Toronto Blue Jays out of West Virginia University.

After being drafted by the Mets, Manoah pitched with the Mets' rookie teams, first the GCL Mets in 2014 and then he was assigned to the Kingsport Mets during the 2015 season after acquiring a 2.63 ERA in eight games pitched with GCL. Manoah had a short stint with the Brooklyn Cyclones, a Short-Season A classification team, towards the end of the 2015 season. He was traded to the Angels for right-handed pitcher Fernando Salas in 2016.

Manoah was then assigned to the Burlington Bees in September of 2017 and then he was promoted to the 66ers, where he spent the rest of his time. Throughout parts of two seasons with the 66ers, Manoah posted a collective 7.71 ERA in 113.2 inning pitched throughout 33 games. He was released by the Inland Empire 66ers on May 7, 2019.
