Magliaro, a career reliever, has 149 appearances in the minor leagues with a 4.81 ERA in 200.1 innings. After graduating in 2012, he spent the winter competing in several tryouts as a pitcher where the Rockies took notice and signed him as a free agent pitcher. The Rockies would send him to Tri-City in the Northwest League his first year where he would go 2-2 with a 3.90 ERA. This season in three outings he is 0-0 with a 7.36 ERA all in relief.

### Roster Moves

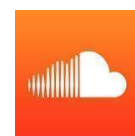
The T-Bones roster once again has a move prior to the Sunday's game. The club added RHP **Jon Perrin** and placed LHP **Carlos Diaz** on the Inactive list. It has been a busy week for the T-Bones. The team signed seven-year Major Leaguer **Daniel Nava** and former T-Bone **Dylan Tice**. To get to the American Association roster number of 23 the team released OF **Daniel Robertson** but have added him to the coaching staff as Hitting Coach. **Bill Sobbe** will stay at third base but also take over the pitching coach duties. Sobbe served as the pitching coach for the club from until 2014-2016. Friday the T-Bones sold the contract of LHP **Eric Stout** to the Cincinnati Reds and RHP **Kevin Lenik** to the Boston Red Sox. On Thursday the team inked former Big Leaguer righty **Eduardo Paredes** to the roster.

### About the Milkmen

The Milwaukee Milkmen are the newest members of the American Association. They are set to open their brand-new ballpark Routine Field a 15-million-dollar park on Monday June 24<sup>th</sup> against the Gary SouthShore RailCats. In the meantime, the play their home games in Kokomo, Indiana where the team ownership group owns a team in the Northwoods League. The Milkmen are 11<sup>th</sup> in the circuit at the plate at .233 average and are 10<sup>th</sup> in ERA checking in at a 4.53. Nolan Earley and Manuel Boscan each lead the team with 11 RBIs Former T-Bone Myles Smith is off to a good start with 15 strike outs in 7.1 innings of relief with four saves and yet to allow an run.

# Steak Bites from the Steakhouse

## The wrong direction

Just how good have the T-Bones been since 2017? The team has finished above .500 in back to back seasons a franchise first, won a title, qualified for post season twice, set a first and second highest win total. Add to spending almost 200 days above .500 things have been very good. The current losing streak of five games is only the third time the team has lost more than three in that stretch. The club suffered three streaks of three losses last season and in 17 had two streaks of five games in the loss column. It is the current longest skid since the team lost five during the month of August 2017.

## Buy Local

With the addition of RHP Jon Perrin from Olathe the T-Bones add another local connection to the roster. He joins right-hander **Robert Calvano** from Kansas City, Infielder **Shawn O'Malley** who lives in Overland Park on the pitching staff. RHP **Dustin Hurlbutt** is from Coffeyville, Kansas, and IF **Casey Gillaspie** is a former Wichita State star.

## Sell Sell Sell

The T-Bones had a pair of contracts purchased today by Major League organizations. LHP **Eric Stout** was purchased by the Cincinnati Reds. The former Royal was joined by his AAA teammate from last season at Omaha in RHP **Kevin Lenik** who was purchased as well today by the Boston Red Sox. That makes three this season joining Randal Delgado who was signed by the New York Yankees last Friday.

## Tice Tice Baby

**Dylan Tice** hit .333 in 68 games with one home run and 16 RBIs while holding down the leadoff spot for KC last season until August 5<sup>th</sup>. The next day he became the 38th Kansas City player and the eighth that season to have his contract purchased when the New York Mets came calling. Tice was among the league leaders at the plate all season last year. The Perkasio, Pennsylvania native was ninth in the league in average, 4th with 55 runs scored, 5th in hits with 91 and 4th in on base percentage at .428 when he was sold. Tice walked 41 times and added 12 stolen bases to a T-Bones club that flourished all season with him at the top of the batting order. He was second on the club in stolen bases and was hit by a team-leading seven pitches last season. Tice came to Kansas City following an All-Star season where he hit .327 for the Rockland Boulders of the CAN-AM League in 2017. Tice was drafted by the St. Louis Cardinals in the 36th round of the 2015 MLB Draft out of West Chester University of Pennsylvania. He would spend parts of two seasons with the Cardinals organization, reaching high A Palm Beach in the Florida State League in 2016. In 40 games he hit .288 with a homer and 18 RBIs in 2016. Tice spent eight games at low A Peoria in the Midwest League, hitting a home run and driving in six runs in 35 at bats, and he spent another 20 games at short season A State College in the New York-Penn League with two long balls, 10 RBIs and a .281 batting average. Tice spent 41 games following the 2015 draft with the Cardinals Gulf Coast League club. He hit .280 with one home run and 22 RBIs in his rookie season.

## Double vision

The T-Bones have been rained out five times since Friday the 17<sup>th</sup> the opening night of the season. They have played four double headers after playing only four all of last season. The club was only washed away three times all season at home last year. The first did not come until August 15<sup>th</sup> against Fargo. The second came four days later on August 19<sup>th</sup> against Cleburne in a game that was not made up with the T-Bones only playing 99 games. The weather forced another rainout in Texas on June 7<sup>th</sup> the other double headers was a scheduled pair in Lincoln. This season the club was washed away on Saturday the 18<sup>th</sup> against Fargo and made up the next day the 19<sup>th</sup>. The back to back rain outs at home against Lincoln on the 20<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup> and Friday night in Winnipeg. The back to back on Monday and Tuesday was the fourth time that the T-Bones have had back to back rainouts in a season. The last time was in 2015 when the T-Bones were washed away on back to back nights in Joplin on June 17<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup> that season. In 2003 the last series was hampered by rain. On August 30<sup>th</sup> and 31<sup>st</sup> the T-Bones and the Sioux Falls Canaries had back to backs over Labor Day weekend eventually finishing the series with a single game on the 1<sup>st</sup>. In 2004 there was a suspended game followed by a rainout and the most famous of all was the 2008 Northern League Finals where Gary had a sink hole in left field with three days of rain to hold off the KC Championship celebration.

Catcher **Christian Correa** spent his third straight May in T-Bones camp. The T-Bones have eight returning players from last year with addition of IF **Dylan Tice**. RHP **Tommy Collier**, LHP **Nick Lee**, RHP **Jackson Lowery**, RHP **Robert Calvano**, LHP **Carlos Diaz**, OF **Ryan Brett** and IF **Mason Davis**.

## Jacobs Returns for Third Stint in Kansas City

The Kansas City T-Bones and manager Andy McCauley have announced the signing of outfielder Greg Jacobs to a contract for the 2009 season. Infielder Neb Brown has also been activated from the inactive list.

Jacobs, 32, was originally selected by the Los Angeles Angels in the 13th round of the 1998 amateur draft. After seven seasons as a professional, the slugger joined the T-Bones in June 2005. He finished the year in Kansas City with a .348 (89-for-256) batting average. Following 2006, when Jacobs hit .333 (111-for-333) with the T-Bones, his contract was purchased by the Philadelphia Phillies.

Jacobs played in the Phillies organization for one year and then moved to the Los Angeles Dodgers system for the beginning of the 2008 season before rejoining the T-Bones in the middle of July. He began the 2009 season with Tabasco of the Mexican League.

“Greg has proven himself as an offensive force in this league,” said McCauley. “He will solidify the middle of our lineup and we are glad to have him back for the 2009 season.”

In his previous stints with Kansas City, Jacobs holds a .350 career batting average and a .594 career slugging percentage, both franchise records. He is in the top five in seven other career franchise offensive categories for the T-Bones, including doubles, triples, home runs, runs scored, total bases and walks. He is also the career leader for Kansas City (since the team's move in 2003) with a .437 on-base percentage.

In his season debut, Jacobs went three-for-four with two doubles and an RBI.

Neb Brown is another new addition to the T-Bones active roster. The infielder has been on the inactive list since the beginning of the season. Brown, in his third year with Kansas City, holds a .302 career mark with 15 home runs and 97 RBI as T-Bone.

Right-hander **Marc Magliaro** arrives in KCK with a five-year resume of pro baseball experience, all with the Colorado Rockies organization. Magliaro, a career reliever, has 149 appearances in the minor leagues with a 4.81 ERA in 200.1 innings. In 2018 Magliaro pitched in 36 games for AA Hartford in the Eastern League. He would post a 3-4 record with a 4.44 ERA in 48.2 innings with 51 strike outs. He gave up 24 earned runs on 49 hits at AA last season. Magliaro spent the entire 2017 season at high A Lancaster in the California League. He would work in 61.2 innings over 41 games out of the pen with a 5.11 ERA. Magliaro would strike out 53 while surrendering 73 hits and allowing 35 earned runs.

The 2016 season was a big bounce back season for Magliaro. He would come into 2016 after having missed all of the 2015 season recovering from a torn ulnar collateral ligament. Magliaro split time between high A Modesto in the California League and short season A Boise in the Northwest League. He would pitch, in relief, in 11 games at each stop, working 14.1 at Modesto with a 6.91 ERA and another 12.2 innings at Boise with a 0.71 ERA. He allowed just one earned run for Boise in 2016.

He had a busy 2014 season, making three stops in the Rockies organization. Magliaro tossed 28.1 innings in 19 games at rookie level Grand Junction in the Pioneer League. He added 22 strikeouts, giving up 18 earned runs on 39 hits with a 1-1 record and one save. He would appear in one game and give up three earned runs at short season A Tri-City and another three games at low A Asheville in the South Atlantic League. At Asheville he would work three relief innings and give up two earned runs.

Magliaro's route to the Rockies organization was not a traditional route for a pitcher. He was a non-drafted free agent signee out of Rowan University (New Jersey) in 2013, but he did not pitch until his senior season. Magliaro would make a name for himself in college as a shortstop. He was a four-year starter at short with a .328 career batting average in 164 games. He registered 212 hits in 647 at bats with 115 runs scored and 85 RBIs. He stole 39 bases in 50 attempts and produced a .393 on-base percentage while serving as team captain his final year. During his senior season, Magliaro began to close games for Rowan and would notch five saves in eight games over 8.1 innings with four strike outs and no earned runs in 2012.

After graduating in 2012, he spent the winter competing in several tryouts as a pitcher where the Rockies took notice and signed him as a free agent pitcher. The Rockies would send him to Tri-City in the Northwest League his first year where he would go 2-2 with a 3.90 ERA. He would work in 27 games and cover 30 innings with 24 strikeouts in his rookie season. He would earn his first professional victory in his first professional appearance, tossing 1.2 scoreless innings in a 4-3 home win against Vancouver on June 16.

At Rowan University as a senior he was named to the New Jersey Athletic Conference (NJAC) All-Conference second team. Magliaro also was chosen to the New Jersey Collegiate Baseball Association (NJCBA) Division II/III All-State first team. He earned NCAA Newport News Regional All-Tournament Team honors. In 2011, Magliaro was selected to the NJAC All-Conference first team and NJCBA Division II/III All-State second teams. He earned NJCBA All-Rookie Team honors as a freshman. Magliaro posted a .328 career batting average in 164 games with the Profs while in college. He also stole 39 bases and scored 115 runs as a four-year starter at shortstop. The 29-year-old right-hander played his high school ball at Monroe Township High School in Monroe, New Jersey

**KANSAS CITY – Kan.** – The Kansas City T-Bones announced today that the club has added former Royals farmhand and Olathe, Kansas native right-hander Jon Perrin, before Sunday’s afternoon game, and he will start for the club against the Gary SouthShore RailCats.

**Jon Perrin** hails from the Kansas City metro area having lettered two years at Olathe East High School before playing college ball in the Big 12 at Oklahoma State University. He was drafted twice while with the Cowboys signing as the 27th round pick by the Milwaukee Brewers in 2015. Perrin spent parts of four season with the Brewers organization before being traded to the Kansas City Royals in 2018.

Perrin joins the T-Bones roster after playing in parts of three seasons with the Milwaukee Brewers and Kansas City Royals organizations. After spending some time in the rookie leagues, he made it up to the Brewers’ Triple-A club, the Colorado Springs Sky Sox. In his time with Colorado Springs, he accumulated a 2-0 record with a 2.59 ERA in 18 games and 24.1 innings pitched while allowing seven earned runs.

During the 2018 season, Perrin was traded to the Kansas City Royals in exchange for Sal Biasi. Perrin spent one season with KC pitching at AA Northwest Arkansas. Perrin started five games for the Northwest Arkansas Naturals, posting a 1-2 record with a 3.38 ERA. He pitched in 21.1 innings while giving up eight runs. He is a career 14-22 with a 3.20 ERA. The Omaha Storm Chasers released Perrin on May 28, 2019.
