Last Game

The T-Bones extended their season long winning streak to 10 game with a sweep of the double header. Game 1 KC got just enough offense including solo shot from Shawn O'Malley a key double from Casey Gillaspie and a sac fly from Christian Correa to go along with five scoreless innings from newly signed T-Bone Akeem Bostick in the 3-2 win. In game 2 it was seven innings from Jose Mesa Jr who surrendered only one run in the first and a Roy Morales homer that kept the game at 1-1 through five. In the sixth Casey Gillaspie hit a three-run blast to left to make it 4-1 and the final score in favor of KC.

Today

The T-Bones continue a key six game road trip with the final game of a three-game series with the Texas AirHogs.

Pitching Matchup

RHP Tommy Collier takes the hill for KC today. The Houston native returns to KCK after a stellar season in 2018. Collier was terrific all season long and came up big for the T-Bones in the American Association playoffs. Collier tossed seven innings in the first-round division series clincher in a 4-2 win over Sioux City at Lewis and Clark Park in Iowa. He scattered four hits and allowed just one earned run to help push the T-Bones on to the championship series. He then hurled eight innings, giving up three earned runs in a 7-3 T-Bones win to take a 2-1 series lead over the Saints in the Championship series. He would go 2-0 in the post season and give up four earned runs in 15 innings with 11 strike outs. He is 7-5 with a 4.15 ERA on the season for KC with 81 strikeouts in 90 innings.

RHP Erik Manoah makes the start for Texas. Manoah spent seven games with the T-Bones signing with the club on June 9th after his release from high A Inland Empire with the Los Angeles Angels of Anaheim system. Manoah was drafted by the New York Mets in the 13th round of the 2014 Draft out of South Dade High School in Homestead, Florida. Manoah pitched with the Inland Empire 66ers in 2018, a Class A Advanced associate of the Los Angeles Angels. Manoah is also the brother of Alek Manoah, who most recently got drafted in the first round of the 2019 draft to the Toronto Blue Jays out of West Virginia University. Manoah spent two years with the New York Mets organization and another four with the Los Angeles Angels of Anaheim system.

Up next

Following the series with Texas and the second of three trips to the Lone Star State for the month of August, the road trip will continue at Sioux City for the team's first of two visits to Iowa this month.

The T-Bones lead the league in hitting batters from the mound. The club leads the circuit with 63 hit by pitches. Last season the team was tied for second most in the AA with 68. The batters have been hit 37 times this season after being hit only 45 times all last season and this season are 7th.

High water mark

The T-Bones are on a season high 10-game winning streak and are a season high eight games above .500.

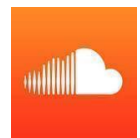
About the Airhogs

Kansas City is on a 10-game winning streak. The T-Bones won nine in a row twice once in 2004 from August 21 to August 31 and the second last June from the 18th through the 28th. Those two streaks are the franchise longest along with the current ride of eight being achieved three times. It is tied for the second longest streak in the league this season behind the Sioux City Explorers who won 12 from July 19th – July 31st and tied with Fargo-Moorhead who won 10 from June 18th – June 27th earlier this season.

Deep and deeper

Shawn O'Malley hit two home runs Wednesday night against Cleburne. He added another last night in game one. He joins Dylan Tice who had a two long ball night on July 29th at St. Paul. Mason Davis had a two-home run game last season on 7/17/18 at Cleburne, while last season he was joined by Zach Walters who hit two vs. Chicago on 5/25/19 in the Dogs first regular season home game in their history and Noah Perio Jr. who went deep twice in a game a pair of times. The first was on 8/16/18 against Fargo and the second to time on 8/24 against Winnipeg. O'Malley has 10 RBI in his last 10 games.

Quality

The T-Bones Dylan Baker has tossed three straight quality starts of three earned runs or less while pitching at least six innings. This last time through the rotation he was joined by Tommy Collier, Jon Perrin and Christian Binford. Perrin has tossed two in a row vs. Cleburne.

All- Time Vs. AirHogs

Overall KC is 45-29 against Texas/G.P. for a .608 winning percentage. Vs. Texas. This is the third meeting between the two clubs this season. The T-Bones won the first three games of the season in Texas and then took two of three in July at JustBats Field at T-Bones Stadium. Currently KC is 10-1 on the season against Texas.

Solid Start

Last night the T-Bones starters of **Akeem Bostick** and **Jose Mesa Jr** combined to toss 12 innings allowing just one earned run.

Series History

The T-Bones have no-hit the AirHogs twice for their only two no hitters in franchise history. In 2017 the T-Bones recorded their first no hitter against Texas on July 27, 2017 with Matt Sergey tossing a seven-inning no-hitter. Sergey allowed just two walks punched out 10 in the seven-inning game. The AirHogs were able to grab the lead on a steal of home by Casio Grider in the top of the seventh but KC came back to walk it off with a Cedric Hunter two RBI double off the mini monster in left to seal the win. It was the T-Bones first no hitter as members of the American Association and the second of his career or Sergey. Then on July 5th, 2018 at Texas, KC would toss a combined no-hitter in game two of a doubleheader. It was the second straight season the T-Bones have not hit the Airhogs. Up until Eddie Medina of St. Paul tossed his not hitter this season two of the previous three no hitters for the league had been walk off no hitters both involving KC. The T-Bones were victims of the feat on June 2nd, 2016 at Gary with Karl Triana doing the feat for the RailCats. To put that into perspective it has only happened six time in Major League Baseball the last in 2013.

T-Bones Snap Losing Streak Against RailCats

8/17/2008

KANSAS CITY, Kan. – The Kansas City T-Bones snapped a 10-game losing streak against the Gary SouthShore RailCats tonight, 16-8, in front of 5,019 fans at CommunityAmerica Ballpark.

The first three T-Bones reached in the first inning off Gary starter Drew Dickinson, the first scoring on an RBI single by Greg Jacobs. Jim Fasano then hit his league-leading 20th home run to give the T-Bones a 4-0 lead. Gary scored one in the top of the second inning on a solo home run by Steve Haake off Kenny Durost (pictured). Kansas City then added four more in the second inning on a pair of two-run home runs by Aharon Eggleston and Eric Scriven, making the score 8-1.

The T-Bones scored one in the third on a two-out double by Geoff McCallum, plating Steve Trout from second. Kansas City went scoreless in the fourth before Craig Hurba and Neb Brown hit back-to-back home runs in the fifth. The T-Bones scored three in the frame, extending their lead to 12-1.

Dickinson left after five innings having surrendered 12 runs on 13 hits as he fell to 5-6 on the season.

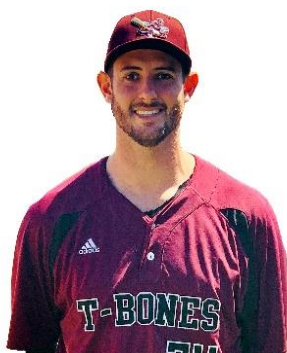
Gary added two runs in the sixth off Durost to finish his outing. The T-Bones right-hander allowed three runs on eight hits as he improved to 8-4 on the campaign.

Payton Tweddale relieved Durost in the seventh and surrendered a two-run home run to Mike Rohde to push the score to 12-5. Mike Reese entered the game in the seventh for Gary and gave up four runs on two hits and five walks. Anthony Esquer finished the game for the RailCats with a scoreless eighth.

Todd Moser threw a scoreless eighth before David Trahan came in for the ninth. Trahan surrendered a three-run home run to Cristian Guerrero to cap the scoring at 16-8.

The two teams face off tomorrow in the fourth game of a five-game series. Chris Rhoads takes the hill for the T-Bones against Tony Cogan for the RailCats. First pitched is scheduled for 7:05.

Tommy Collier returns to KCK after a stellar season in 2018. The Houston native was terrific all season long and came up big for the T-Bones in the American Association playoffs. Collier tossed seven innings in the first-round division series clincher in a 4-2 win over Sioux City at Lewis and Clark Park in Iowa. He scattered four hits and allowed just one earned run to help push the T-Bones on to the championship series. Collier was not able to pitch the first two games at St. Paul in the league finals, but when the series shifted to Kansas City and his turn came up five days later, he again delivered. He hurled eight innings, giving up three earned runs in a 7-3 T-Bones win to take a 2-1 series lead over the Saints. He would go 2-0 in the post season and give up four earned runs in 15 innings with 11 strike outs. The right-hander would twice earn Rawlings Pitcher of the Month honors in June and July and would put up an impressive streak over the course of his last 15 starts of the regular season. In all 15 starts, from June 18th until August 30th, Kansas City went 15-0 as a team in Collier's 15 starts. He would pick up 11 wins on his record, and in the other four starts, he would throw four more quality starts of three earned runs or fewer in at least six innings. In his other start in that stretch, he went five innings with six punch outs in another T-Bones win. For the season, the former Detroit Tigers farm hand would go 12-3 with 140 strike outs in 133 innings of work. He issued just 22 walks in 20 starts with a 3.11 ERA. Combined for the regular and post season Collier would post a 14-4 record in 156 innings with 160 strike outs. Collier would throw 16 quality starts out of 23 turns in the rotation. He pitched at least six innings in 21 of his last 22 starts for the T-Bones. Collier also won eight of his 10 road starts, and the T-Bones won all 10 of his starts away from T-Bones Stadium, including game five of the American Association Division Series where he was the winner. Collier finished second in the American Association in innings pitched in 2018, and his 12 wins tied for the league lead. His 140 strike outs led the Association, and Collier owns the record for the most in a single season by a T-Bones pitcher. He would break the old record of 139 that Johnathan Krysa reached in 2004. The 12 wins was the fourth highest total for a single season in franchise history. Tommy Collier, joined the T-Bones after spending 2011-2016 with the Detroit Tigers organization and reaching AA Erie in 2016, posting a career 41-37 record and a 3.88 ERA in 650 innings with Detroit. Collier has pitched in the Venezuela Winter League for La Guaira in 2016-2017 and 2017-2018, pitching in 64 innings with a 4.22 ERA over the two combined seasons. This past winter, he played in the Mexican Winter League for Obregon, going 2-4 with a 5.32 ERA. Collier was the 22nd round pick of the Tigers in the 2011 MLB June Amateur Draft out of San Jacinto College in Houston, Texas. He went 4-1 with a 1.85 ERA in his rookie season with Connecticut in the New York/Penn League in 2011. In 2012 he made the jump to low A West Michigan, going 9-8, and he led all the starters on the club with a 2.74 ERA in 24 starting nods. In 2013, 2014 and 2015, Collier split time between High A Lakeland and AA Erie and spent 2013 in the prestigious Arizona Fall League with Mesa. Collier combined for a 4.43 ERA in 67 innings in 2013 in, and in 2014, he tossed 133 innings with a 5.75 ERA for Detroit. The right-hander went 7-8 in 2015 with a 3.70 ERA in 155.2 innings combined at both stops. At AA Erie in 2016, the Houston, Texas native won a career high nine games in 25 starts with 130.2 innings with a 4.20 ERA. Collier led the SeaWolves in wins and innings pitched that season, adding 87 strike outs. In 2008, Collier was drafted by the Milwaukee Brewers out of high school in the 29th round of the MLB Draft from Cypress-Fairbanks High School in Cypress, Texas. He was then drafted in the 49th round by Toronto in 2009 while at San Jacinto College, but he did not sign.
